Biography- A book about someone's life written by another person.

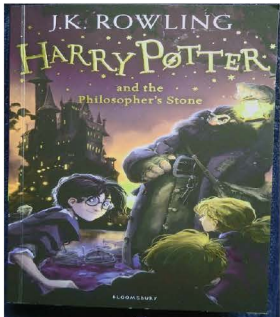
Autobiography- A book about someone's life written by that person.

Mystery- A book about someone solving a crime or puzzle.

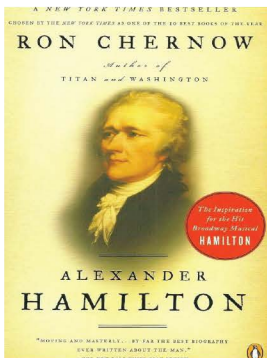
Science Fiction- A book that deals imaginative and futuristic concepts.

Reference- A book used to look up specific, factual information.

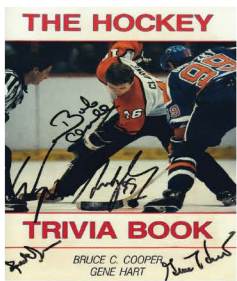
Fantasy- A fictional book that changes something ordinary into something imaginary and outside of reality.



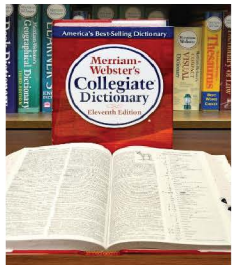
A book about a young Wizard, and his friends that go to an imaginary school of Witchcraft and Wizardry.



A book about Alexander Hamilton, one of the Founding Fathers of the United States. Written by Ron Chernow.



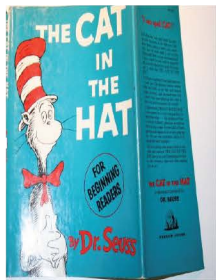
A book containing true facts and trivia about hockey.



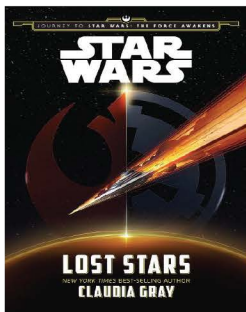
A book you can refer to find out definitions to words.



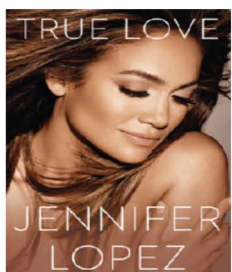
A book series about two young boys that try to solve cases.
